Summary of report:

RECOMMENDATIONS:

That the Council approves the formal council tax resolutions as detailed below:

- 1. That it be noted that on 16 January 2013 the Chief Executive and Strategic Directors, under delegated authority from full Council, approved the Council Tax Base for the year 2013/14:
 - (a) for the whole Council area as 18,920.79 in accordance with regulation 3 of the Local Authorities (Calculation of Council Tax Base)(England) Regulations 2012; and
 - (b) for dwellings in those parts of its area to which a Parish precept relates in accordance with regulation 6 of the Local Authorities (Calculation of Council Tax Base)(England) Regulations 2012 as in the attached **Appendix A**.
- 2. That the Council Tax requirement for West Devon Borough Council's own purposes for 2013/14 (excluding Parish precepts) is calculated at £3,797,213 (Appendix B).

3. That the following amounts are calculated by the Council for the year 2013/14 in accordance with Sections 31 to 36 of the Local Government Finance Act 1992 and the Localism Act 2011 (Appendix B): (a) £30,277,429 being the aggregate of the amounts which the Council estimates for the items set out in Section 31A (2) of the Act taking into account all precepts issued to it by Parish/Town Councils (Gross expenditure including parish precepts). (b) £25,427,862 being the aggregate of the amounts which the Council estimates for the items set out in Section 31A (3) of the Act (Total income including formula grant and council tax surplus). £4,849,567 being the amount by which the aggregate at 3(a) above (c) exceeds the aggregate at 3(b) above, calculated by the Council in accordance with Section 31A(4) of the Act as its Council Tax requirement for the year. (Item R in the formula in Section 31B of the Act) (Council tax requirement including parish precepts). (d) £256.31 being the amount at 3(c) above (Item R), all divided by Item T (1(a) above), calculated by the Council, in accordance with Section 31B of the Act, as the basic amount of its Council Tax for the year (Average band D council tax for West Devon Borough Council and parishes). (e) £1,052,354 being the aggregate amount of all special items (Parish precepts) referred to in Section 34(1) of the Act (as per the attached Appendix C - parish precepts).

- 6. That the Council has concluded that the basic amount of Council Tax for West Devon Borough Council for 2013/14 is not excessive in accordance with principles approved under Section 52ZB Local Government Finance Act 1992. (see calculation at **Appendix B**).

1. BACKGROUND

1.1 The Localism Act 2011 has made significant changes to the Local Government Finance Act 1992, and now requires the billing authority to calculate a council tax requirement for the year, not a budget requirement as previously. West Devon Borough Council is a billing authority.

- 1.2 Precepts have been notified to us from the Parish and Town Councils, Devon County Council, Devon and Cornwall Police Authority and Devon and Somerset Fire and Rescue Authority. These are detailed below:
- (i) Town & Parish Councils

The Town & Parish Council Precepts for 2013/14 are detailed in Appendix **C** and total £1,052,354. The increase in the average Band D Council Tax for Town and Parish Councils is 2.5% and results in an average Band D Council Tax figure of £55.62 for 2013/14.

(ii) Devon County Council

Devon County Council met on 21st February 2013 and set their precept at £21,122,413.12 adjusted by a Collection Fund contribution of £352,123. This results in a Band D Council Tax of £1,116.36

(iii) Devon and Cornwall Police and Crime Commissioner

Devon and Cornwall Police Authority met on 8th February 2013 and set their precept at £3,082,575.11, adjusted by a Collection Fund contribution of £49,454. This results in a Band D Council Tax of £162.92.

(iv) Devon and Somerset Fire and Rescue Authority

Devon & Somerset Fire & Rescue Service met on 18th February 2013 and set their precept at £1,426,438 adjusted by a Collection Fund contribution of £22,654. This results in a Band D Council Tax of £75.39.

2. LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

- 2.1 The Council is required by law to approve the Council Tax taking into account the requirements of our precepting bodies.
- 2.2 The Localism Act 2011 has made significant changes to the Local Government Finance Act 1992 and now requires the billing authority to calculate a council tax requirement for the year, not its budget requirement as previously.
- 2.3 As billing authority, the Council must determine whether the Council's basic amount of Council Tax for 2013/14 is excessive in accordance with principles approved under Section 52ZB Local Government Finance Act 1992. These principles are set by the Secretary of State each year. Where the amount of council tax for a financial year is "excessive" within the meaning of the principles, it will place the authority under a duty to hold a referendum. For the financial year 2013/14, according to the current principles the basic amount of council tax will not be excessive if it is less than 2%. Within those terms, the proposed increase in the billing authority's council tax is not excessive and will not trigger a referendum.

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3. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

- 3.1 The Council is required to calculate and approve the Council Tax requirement for 2013/14.
- 3.2 The table below shows how an average Band D council bill is made up for West Devon Borough Council:

CM 82 COUNCIL TAX RESOLUTIONS 2013/14

The Acting Head of Finance and Audit presented a report which had been circulated separately to the agenda and which sought to enable the Council to calculate and approve the Council Tax requirement for 2013/14.

The calculations and setting of the Council Tax had taken account of the precepts notified from Devon County Council, Devon & Cornwall Police and Crime Commissioner, Devon & Somerset Fire & Rescue Authority and the Town & Parish Councils, together with the Borough Council.

It was then moved by Cllr P R Sanders and seconded by Cllr B E Baldwin and upon the motion being submitted to the meeting was declared to be **CARRIED** and "**RESOLVED** that the formal council tax resolutions (as detailed below) be approved:-

- 1. That it be noted that on 16 January 2013, the Chief Executive and Strategic Directors, under delegated authority from full Council, approved the Council Tax Base for the year 2013/14.
 - (a) For the whole Council area as 18,920.79 in accordance with Regulation 3 of the Local Authorities (Calculation of Council Tax Base)(England) Regulations 2012; and
 - (b) For dwellings in those parts of its area to which a Parish precept relates in accordance with regulation 6 of the Local Authorities (Calculation of Council Tax Base)(England) Regulations 2012, as in Appendix A to the presented agenda report.
- 2. That the Council Tax requirement for West Devon Borough Council's own purposes for 2013/14 (excluding Parish precepts) is calculated at £3,797,213 (Appendix B of the presented agenda report refers);
- 3. That the following amounts are calculated by the Council for the year 2013/14 in accordance with Sections 31 to 36 of the Local Government Finance Act 1992 and the Localism Act 2011 (Appendix B of the presented agenda report refers):
 - (a) £30,277,429 being the aggregate of the amounts which the Council estimates for the items set out in Section 31A (2) of the Act taking into account all precepts issued to it by Parish/Town Councils (Gross expenditure including parish precepts).
 - (b) £25,427,862 being the aggregate of the amounts which the Council estimates for the items set out in Section 31A (3) of the Act (Total income including formula grant and council tax surplus).

(c) £4,849,567 being the amount by which the aggregate at 3(a) above exceeds the aggregate at 3(b) above calculated by the Council, in accordance with Section 31A(4) of the Act as its Council Tax requirement for the year (Item R in the formula in Section 31B of the Act) (Council Tax requirement including parish precepts).

(d) £256.31 being the amount at 3(c) above (Item R), all divided by Item T (1(a) above), calculated by the Council, in accordance with Section 31B of the Act, as the basic amount of its Council Tax for the year (Average band D council tax for West Devon Borough Council and parishes).

(e) £1,052,354 being the aggregate amount of all special items (Parish precepts) referred to in Section 34(1) of the Act (as per the attached Appendix C of the presented agenda refers).

(f) £200.69 being the amount at 3(d) above less the result given by dividing the amount at 3(e) above by Item T (1(a) above), calculated by the Council, in accordance with Section 34(2) of the Act, as the basic amount of its Council Tax for the year for dwellings in those parts of its Council Tax for the year for dwellings in those parts of its area to which no Parish precept relates (Band D council tax for West Devon Borough Council only).

4. That it be noted the County Council, the Police and Crime Commissioner and the Fire Authority have issued precepts to the Council in accordance with Section 40 of the Local Government Finance Act 1992 for each of the categories of dwellings as shown below:
