Summary of report:

To determine an application for a new Premises Licence at **Dart Marina Hotel & Spa**, **Sandquay Road**, **Dartmouth**, **TQ6 9PH** in accordance with Section 18 of the Licensing Act 2003. Relevant representation has been received but mediation has taken place with amendments being made to the application. As a result all parties consider a hearing is unnecessary.

Financial implications:

There are no direct financial implications to the Council from this Report.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

That the Sub-Committee consider the application for a new Premises Licence and make a determination in respect of this application, namely to:

- i grant the application as submitted, subject to any Mandatory Conditions required:
- ii modify the conditions of the licence;
- iii exclude any of the licensable activities to which the application relates;
- iv to refuse to specify a person in the licence as the premises supervisor:
- v reject the application,

in line with the licensing objectives (Section 4) contained within the Licensing Act 2003.

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1. BACKGROUND

- 1.1 The Licensing Authority received an application for a new premises licence on 26 March 2012 for **Dart Marina Hotel & Spa, Sandquay Road, Dartmouth, TQ6 9PH.** A copy of the application is attached **(Appendix 'A')**.
- 1.2 The application is for a new premises licence for:
 - sale of alcohol for consumption on and off the premises daily from 11am to 11.30pm (residents 24hrs);
 - late night refreshment daily from 11pm to midnight (residents 11pm to 5am);
 - films daily from 10am to 11.30pm;
 - recorded music and facilities for dancing daily from 11am to 11pm;
 - live music (inside and outside) daily from 11am to 11pm.
- 1.3 As the applicant wishes to provide the sale of alcohol and the provision of regulated entertainment, under the Licensing Act 2003 a premises licence is required. As regards to this application, only Interested Parties, Responsible Authorities or District Councillors may make representations.
- 1.4 We have received three representations in respect of this application. These can be found in **Appendix 'B'**. The representation received from the Police was concerned with the sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises, given the close proximity to the Designation Order zone. The representations received from Environmental Health and the District Councillor were mainly concerned with noise nuisance caused by outside music.
- 1.5 The Police requested that a further condition be included on the premises licence to prevent customers from taking open vessels off the premises. The premises is in very close proximity to Coronation Park which is within the boundary of the Designation Order zone. There was a concern that people may take open vessels containing alcohol from the premises into this area. The Police have requested that only sealed containers of alcohol may be taken outside of the hatched area as marked on the plan.
- 1.6 The Environmental Health Officer (EHO) was concerned with possible noise disturbance arising from live music being performed outside. It was agreed with the applicant to limit outdoor music to a maximum of three days per year. The EHO also requested that further conditions be included on the premises licence to address general noise nuisance from both music and people.
- 1.7 Through discussion and mediation, all parties have agreed to the suggested amendments shown in **Appendix C**. All parties have agreed that subject to these amendments being implemented on the premises licence, a hearing is unnecessary.

2. ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION

- 2.1 A representation was received from the Police in relation to the prevention of crime and disorder licensing objective. They are satisfied that the licensing objectives will be addressed through the implementation of the agreed amendments.
- 2.2 Representations were received from Environmental Health and a District Councillor in relation to the prevention of public nuisance licensing objective. They are satisfied that the licensing objectives will be addressed through the implementation of the agreed amendments.
- 2.3 The Sub-Committee will now need to consider this application.

3. LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

3.1 The Act requires mandatory conditions to be imposed (if applicable) on the licence, the wording of which is prescribed by the Act but may be summarised as follows:

(a) Section 19 - Mandatory conditions relating to the supply of alcohol

No alcohol may be supplied unless there is a Designated Premises Supervisor who also holds a personal licence.

Every supply of alcohol under a premises licence must be made or authorised by a personal licensee.

(b) Section 19A - Irresponsible drinks promotions

Staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible drinks promotions in relation to the premises.

(c) Section 19A - No alcohol to be dispensed directly into the mouth of another person

No alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another.

(d) Section 19A - Free drinking water

That free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

(e) Section 19A - Age verification policy

- (i) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (ii) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

(f) Section 19A - Minimum measures for alcoholic beverages

The responsible person shall ensure that-

- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-
- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
- (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

(g) Section 20 - Mandatory condition relating to exhibition of films

Children may only be admitted to films in accordance with the classification recommendations of the British Board of Film Classification, or as recommended by the Licensing Authority.

(h) Section 21 - Door Supervision

Where door supervisors are specified by condition, those individuals must be licensed by the SIA.
