## 1. BACKGROUND

- 1.1 The Political Structures Working Group is a standing body of Members appointed at the Annual Council meeting to undertake a comprehensive review of the workings of both the political structure and decision making processes. The Group has no decision-making powers and is required to present its recommendations to the Council.
- 1.2 The Group last met on Monday, 7 July 2014 to consider the LGBCE proposals in respect of the draft warding arrangements for the Borough Council. At the

request of the Working Group, all Members of Council were invited to attend and contribute to the debate at this meeting.

- 1.3 In its deliberations, the Group was specifically asked to consider:-
  - The need for electoral equality.
  - Whether or not the proposed wards reflect the interests and identities of local communities and if not, why not?
  - Whether or not the proposed pattern of wards would help the Council deliver effective local government to local people and if not, why not?
  - Whether the proposals could be improved whilst maintaining electoral equality?
  - Whether or not the proposed ward names were right?
  - Whether or not the Council had any alternative proposals which were backed up by demonstrable evidence?

## 2. ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION

## 2.1 **Electoral Review – Warding Arrangements**

- 2.1.1 On 29 April 2014, the Council received a letter from the LGBCE which introduced its draft recommendations on the future electoral arrangements for the Council (as attached at Appendix 1).
- 2.1.2 At the meeting on 7 July 2014, a number of Members expressed their concerns regarding these draft recommendations and felt that the Council should not offer its support to these proposals.
- 2.1.3 In light of the detailed discussions which ensued at this meeting, a proposed draft response to the LGBCE proposals is attached at Appendix 2. The Council is asked to endorse the draft response, which will then be sent to the LGBCE before its prescribed deadline of 21 July 2014.
- 2.1.4 It is also important to stress that the Commission has not finalised its conclusions and therefore wishes to encourage Members (both individually and/or collectively), town and parish councils, community groups and residents who have a view to write to the Commission (via email at: <a href="mailto:reviews@lgbce.org.uk">reviews@lgbce.org.uk</a>) before 21 July 2014.
