

## **Appendix G Totnes**

### **List of street names for proposed area (a map of this area is shown in Appendix I):**

Fore Street, High Street, Rotherfold, Cistern Street (excluding south of Rotherfold), Leechwell Street, Church Close Guildhall Yard, Ramparts Walk, footpath adjacent to Civic Hall car park, Civic Square, The Plains, Coronation Road (to the entrance of the Fire Station). Open space at Rotherfold, Civic Hall car park, St Mary's churchyard, The Lamb and Heath's Gardens, the footpath from Coronation Road to Babbage Road, pedestrianised area around Town Mill, forecourt of Totnes United Free Church, Vire Island, Town Quay, Symons Passage. Steamer Quay Car Park and adjacent road. Longmarsh park area.

### **There were three responses from Totnes, below is a summary:**

I live in Totnes and think that on paper (or on screen) **the alcohol restrictions are good.**

The implementation of an Alcohol PSPO **would go a long way in aiding the local community**, and those river users from further afield, in accessing and enjoying the river, as well as having their right of quiet enjoyment of their homes upheld.

At Full (Town) Council on Monday 14<sup>th</sup> December it was **agree to recommend to South Hams District Council that a blanket alcohol public space protection order (PSPO) area is applied across Totnes**, and if this is not acceptable add the following areas to the currently mapped PSPO areas: Borough Park, Follaton Arboretum, the Chicken Run through to Meadow Park in Parkers Way, and the riverside path at the rear of the industrial estate.

### **Neighbourhood Police Team Response:**

**Totnes in my opinion has a clear need for the PSPO to remain in force.** It has a street attached population, night time economy, youth community and high public footfall. The number of incidents which could be attributed, exacerbated or aggravated by alcohol consumption is high, the crimes have been filtered to just public order offences or drunk and disorderly so it is important to note that it does not include violence, which I am sure you will appreciate would raise the figures far higher, but would be more difficult to directly / indirectly link to alcohol consumption in public.

There is a clear Policing need and direct public benefit from the maintenance of the PSPO in Totnes, it provides Officers with additional powers at their disposal to minimise harassment, alarm, distress and harm to our communities.
