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## **Recommendations:**

- 1. That the Harbour Board RESOLVES to adopt the updated SMS
- **1. Executive summary.** This report proposes an updated Safety Management System (SMS) to the Harbour Board for adoption in their role as the Harbour's 'duty holder'.
- **2. Background.** To comply with the Port Marine Safety Code, the Harbour Board as duty holder is individually and collectively accountable for managing operations within the harbour safely and efficiently. A key measure of compliance is the development of a marine safety management system based on formal risk assessment of hazards and risks. At the Feb 15 Harbour Board meeting, the Harbour Master was directed to comprehensively review the existing SMS. The result can be found at Appendix 1 to this report.
- **3. Outcomes/outputs.** Safety within the Harbour continues to improve.
- **4. Options available.** Either retain the existing system, adopt the proposed system or develop a different SMS which meets the approval of the Harbour Board and is compliant with the PMSC.

**5. Proposed Way Forward.** Adopt the proposed SMS and undergo external audit from the designated person and also the MCA.
